Number of campers 15 with a wait list available. Many of us will go Thursday in order to secure the sites needed.

Hiking, nature trails, fishing, rock climbing, a Visitor Center, and Environmental Education Center. Wild bison, elk, turkey, deer and prairie dogs roam freely throughout the refuge. Also, on Saturday October 20 at 5pm there is a Bugling Elk tour available for a small fee. You must reserve a space! It fills up quickly so don't delay. Reservations begin Aug. 27.
