

Before arriving at Big Bend, some members toured McDonald Observatory, one the major astronomical research facilities in the world. Staying at the famous Gage Hotel in Marathon was an historical experience. It was built in 1927 and is famous for its impressive gardens and restaurant.

Big Bend has more than 801,000 acres of mountains and desert - the most remote park in the lower 48 states. We took several hikes into the mountains and saw some beautiful scenery. Puma and bears were sighted, but not by any TOWN members. On our second night of camping we experienced a wind and hail storm. Luckily, no tents were lost!

Our activities included riding in a rowboat across the Rio Grande River and riding burros to Boquillas, Mexico. Eye-opening, to say the least! We also took a rafting trip on the Rio Grande.
