March Hike

Robbie has offered to lead a hike in March. Saturday, March 13th, 11:00 AM, meet at the visitor center in Hagerman National Wildlife Refuge. The plan is to caravan (about 2.2 miles) to the trail head for the Meadow Pond Trail. Bring a mask, water and any sustenance you might need for this 5.7 mile trail. The trail is easy, flat and marked at each mile for the out and back trip. You can do as much or little as you would like. There is very little shade on the trail so a hat and sunscreen might be important.

After the hike you might want to explore the refuge. There are more trails to hike, bird watching, fishing and an Audio Auto Tour.

Reservations at Texas State Parks are open now with a five month window. Weekend dates at the State Parks fill up quickly so you have to plan ahead. Temporary guidelines for State Park use:
Face coverings are required inside all state park buildings.

No groups larger than 10 people are allowed, except for families or people living in the same household.
