# Istanbul

After a glorious week kayaking, biking and eating great food in the islands of Poros and Hydra in Greece, TOWN members Karen Turbeville, Karen King, Rosie Alaniz, (and Bear) had the opportunity to visit the city of Istanbul.



Istanbul is the largest city in Turkey and is among the 15 largest urban areas in the world. Because of its size, Istanbul extends into both Europe and Asia. The city is the world's only metropolis to be on more than one continent.

The city of Istanbul, formerly known as Constantinople, is important to geography, religion, and world culture because it has a long history that spans the rise and fall of the world's most famous empires, such as the Roman Empire, (330-395); the Byzantine Empire (395-1204 and 1261-1453); the Latin Empire, (1204-1261), and the Ottoman Empire (1453-1922). Throughout the centuries, Istanbul has been the center of various religions like the Greek Orthodox Church, the Catholic Church and Islam. Following World War I, the Turkish War of Independence took place, and Istanbul became a part of the Republic of Turkey in 1923.


